

A one-year Research Fellow/Post-doc position on “Sources, modalities, and scales of academic research funding and their impact”.

The successful candidate will be involved in an advanced research project dedicated to the *empirical analysis of the funding of academic research and its impact at the university and/or individual levels* funded by the European Network of Excellence DIME. She/he will manipulate and contribute to the analysis of large administrative, publication and invention dataset.

The candidate will work in an international research project jointly operated by the economic department of the University of Bordeaux IV (GREThA, CNRS), the economic department of the University of Strasbourg (BETA, CNRS) and the economic department Cognetti de Martiis of the University of Torino also in coordination with the Observatoire des Sciences et Techniques (Paris). The work can be performed mainly in any one of these four institutions and the researcher will be located either in Bordeaux, Paris, Strasbourg, or Torino (eventually several).

The position starts first of September or first of October and is granted for 12 months. The proposed wage is attractive and will be negotiated on the basis of competences and location.

Applicants should have completed (or being near to completion) a PhD in Economics/Organization/Business. They should be familiar with database management and econometric methods. An interest either in the “economics of science”, “economics of innovation” or “labour economics” will be strongly appreciated. Preference will also be given to candidates that have demonstrated their abilities to carry out research at top international standards and to publish their results in international journals.

Applications should be sent by the 1st of August 2009 the latest but earlier applications are much welcomed. Candidates should send a CV, a statement of research interests (max 600 words), up to three selected publications or unpublished work and two names and email addresses of references to Professor Nicolas Carayol, Université Bordeaux IV (by email: nicolas.carayol@u-bordeaux4.fr).
